### WHAT IS...?

Recently I overheard a conversation between 2 gentleman. They were discussing the difference between the blue and gold jackets (Regalia) that our Fellows and Pilgrims wear. Neither of them knew what the different colors represented. I explained the two colors as best I could. In consideration of this conversation I decided we all need a little refresher, so here it is! Aww...for the times when enrollment ceremonies provided new members the opportunity to listen to the story of the Moose and its importance.

The Moose Legion? The Supreme Council authorized the creation of the Moose Legion of the Moose Fraternity, known as the Degree of Service, in 1913. The Objectives of the Moose Legion are: a.) Bring together qualified members of the Loyal Order of Moose who desire to make further contributions to the humanitarian objectives of our Order, thus forming a strong foundation for advancement to the Fellowship and Pilgrim degrees. b.) Foster and promote the charitable efforts and fraternal programs of the Order, particularly those that benefit the children at Mooseheart and seniors at Moosehaven. c.) Exemplify the principles of Faith, Hope, Charity and Loyalty. d.) Encourage members to conduct themselves in a manner as would be expected of a fraternal leader. The official regalia of a Moose Legionnaire is a maroon blazer featuring the Moose Legion logo, coordinating necktie, white shirt, and black trousers.

The Fellowship Degree of Honor? The Fellowship Degree of Honor is an honorary Degree of the Loyal Order of Moose. It was first created on August 7, 1918. The Degree is conferred only upon Moose Legionnaires who are recommended by the Fellows of their Lodge and approved by the Pilgrim Council. The official regalia of a Fellow is a French-blue blazer featuring the Fellowship logo, coordinated necktie, white shirt and black trousers. The regalia is to be worn in its entirety, or not at all.


A Pilgrim Degree of Merit? The Pilgrim Degree of Merit is the highest honor that can be bestowed upon a member of the Loyal Order of Moose. This Degree is conferred only in the House of God at Mooseheart, Illinois and comes as a reward for extraordinary service to the Order. This degree was originally created on August 1, 1918. All Pilgrims of the Order are sent special recommendation forms annually and may recommend any member of the Order, for this Degree, who has attained the Fellowship Degree of Honor, and meets some other basic minimum qualifications. The official regalia of a Pilgrim is a Gold blazer featuring the Pilgrim logo, with coordinated necktie, white shirt and black trousers. The regalia is to be worn in its entirety, or not at all.

As some of you may know Kohl's Department Store associates were at Mooseheart in April for the fourth straight year to participate in the "Go Green" event. Please share the following news bulletin with our members and ask them to please consider the generosity of Kohl's and their associates when considering a place to shop. Marty, Karen, and Don

MOOSEHEART, May 1 -They sat in a grandstand that had the word "Mooseheart" spelled in large lighted letters behind them and a sign that read "Region One, Kohl's Cares" in front of them. And the fourth annual Kohl's "Go Green" event at Mooseheart was just that kind of partnership of two organizations -- with the people serving as the glue.

During the April 27 event, over 500 Kohl's employees from 53 stores in Illinois and Indiana worked alongside Mooseheart students and staff to beautify the campus, including "Team Gurnee," which came in a van proclaiming their trip to Mooseheart across its windows. Those volunteers, many who had been to Mooseheart in 2012, some since the first event in 2010, worked spreading mulch and they picked up brush and other items. At the end, they watched as an oak tree was planted and dedicated to their efforts over the years.

Throughout, the volunteers talked. One referred to the "Mooseheart Phenomenon." Other discussed their desire to attend the 2014 event. And they talked as they took a campus tour, viewing the 1,000-acre residential home for roughly 220 children in-need -- the largest residential child-care community in Illinois.

All of it was done under surprisingly sunny skies, and to make the day just a bit brighter, a check for more than \$60,000 was given by Kohl's to Moose Charities.

"We were blessed with great weather and great people; words can't even come out to fully express the gratitude of today," Mooseheart Executive Director Gary Urwiler said. "It's a great event, an outstanding event. These people from Kohl's, it's



almost as if they're family now. They've been with us for four years now."

The day started with introductory remarks from Urwiler and Kohl's executives who attended the event. The brief but impactful address came from 2008 Mooseheart graduate Chris Morones, who spent more than 15 years on-campus before graduating second in his class. Now a member of the U.S. Marine Corps, Morones welcomed the volunteers to the place he called home, and reminded them of the special connection between the campus and the children who live there.

"Chris did a phenomenal job," Urwiler said. "For him to come back and give his time and to speak as eloquently as he did was wonderful. It was a small message, but it was a very sincere and heartfelt message."

The work was needed. Mooseheart's campus had been deluged, just as had been every other community in the area during the wettest April on record in northern Illinois. But with the warm weather, the grass has turned from brown to emerald and the benefits from the volunteers' efforts were immediately apparent.

"When you have a 1,000-acre campus, you have a lot of maintenance and upkeep, especially in the spring – and especially this season with all the storms that we have had," Urwiler said.

Mooseheart's children attended and were there to lend more than vocal support. They helped spread mulch, helped dig, helped remove

"The power of people and the amount of people coming together for a great cause is wonderful," Urwiler said. "For us to be able to unite at full strength in order to get work done at a 'Go Green' event like this is incredible. When you combine it with kids working hand-in-hand on our beautiful facilities, it makes for a memorable event."

The work done at the "Go Green" event will be seen by many this

year. The 2013 Moose International Convention is May 24-29 in Milwaukee, WI and thousands will be on-campus for the high school graduation on May 25. Thousands will again descend on Mooseheart on July 27, when the campus celebrates its centennial with a day-long celebration of food, music, fireworks and a rededication ceremony. Since its founding, Mooseheart has operated a complete, accredited kindergarten-through-high-school academic program, plus art, music, vocational training and interscholastic sports. It is an extremely nurturing and student-tailored program, with an average student-teacher ratio of 12-1.

Mooseheart students who complete their studies with a 3.0 GPA or better (4.0=A) are eligible for up to five years of annually renewable scholarship funding, covering tuition, room and board in an amount comparable to that required for an in-state student at an Illinois public university.

Mooseheart is currently home to roughly 210 students, ranging in age from preschoolers to high school seniors. Applications for admission to Mooseheart are considered from any family whose children are, for whatever reason, lacking a stable home environment. Mooseheart boasts its own U.S. Post Office and a fully functioning branch of Fifth Third Bank.

In addition to Mooseheart, Moose International also supports Moosehaven, a 70-acre retirement community near Jacksonville, FL founded in 1922; and conducts more than \$70 million worth of community service programs annually.

That's right - \$0 application fees all year long from May 1, 2013 — April 30, 2014! This applies to all Loyal Order of Moose, Women of the Moose and Moose Legion applications. There is no longer a reason to wait to bring new members into our fraternity.

For all members who sponsor at least one individual into the Fraternity, Moose – GO THE DISTANCE lapel recognition pins will once again be available through all lodges that request them. All chapters and Moose Legion units will automatically be supplied with pins for distribution.

When a member's first two applications are reported and enrolled during this campaign year, he/she will once again qualify for a year's free dues in his/her primary lodge or chapter. Life Members that sponsor two applications will receive a \$15 gift certificate for the Moose Catalog Sales Store.

For each member that qualifies for the 5 Club, \$5 will be donated to the Mooseheart School Renovation project courtesy of your state association, the Women of the Moose and the Moose Legion. We are asking each association to use an additional \$5, which has traditionally been collected to ship award items, as seed money to start a local campaign to help promote membership.





## SO APP FEES ALL YEAR!

Members sponsoring 25 or more during the campaign will qualify for the Circle of Distinction, Heart of Distinction or Moose Legionnaire of Distinction award and have a Centennial Mooseheart Brick dedicated to them during the renovation project. Other incentives are also available depending upon the level achieved, including a free trip to next year's Las Vegas Convention for those signing and enrolling 100 or more members.

A commemorative Moose membership card will be printed for any new or renewed membership that occurs from May 1, 2013 through April 30th, 2014. The cards are gold in color and feature the Mooseheart Centennial Logo in the lower left corner. All other information on the card is exactly the same as before. Both the existing green membership card and the new gold card should be honored at all lodges, assuming the "paid to" date in the lower right corner is current! Cards that are not typically replaced annually (paid in advance, life members, etc.) will not be sent a new card, but can receive one for a small donation to the Mooseheart Renovation Project at the Membership Department display at convention or by contacting the Member Services team by phone any time after June 1st (630-906-3658).
