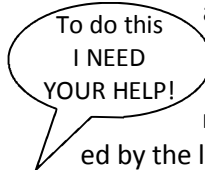
math Falls Special Olympics or Southern Oregon's recent Armed Forces Day).

September is coming and with it is Convention 2014! I hope everyone who can possibly participate ... participates! We have a lot to share with our members and hope you will take advantage of it.

We are already 3 months into our Moose year 2014-2015. How is your lodge doing? Have you implemented any of the “Back to Basics” philosophies shared with your lodges via flyers and e-mail from Moose International? Together we can overcome any adversary and make our Lodges strong.



We have just returned from the International Convention in Las Vegas. It was a terrific convention and Oregon was represented very, very well. The report we received from the Moose Charities board shows some outstanding numbers. First, the fraternity is two thirds of the way to completing the pledge to raise ten million dollars for the Mooseheart School renovation. Second, Moose Charities raised a little over \$13.4 million dollars last fiscal year. This includes \$4.4 million from the Lodges, \$2.5 million from the Chapters, and \$2.9 million from our members. Isn't great to be a Moose!

There was a very informative Moose Charities panel session held at the convention. Oregon was mentioned very prominently during the session. It was a quite a moment, we are very proud of how wonderfully generous all our Oregon members have been. During the session they showed us the newest video presentation. It was very moving and can be seen on “You Tube” please go to the URL listed below, or contact one of us if you have difficulty. The video only takes a few moments and would make a very interesting presentation at a Lodge or Chapter meeting.

Here are some more numbers to take pride in. Thus far Oregon has completed three school naming projects and we have raised a whopping \$73,963 for the school renovation. As of the last report Oregon has also raised \$33,750 dollars for the Donors Circle. That places us in sixth place nationally, straight up, not per capita. Amazingly we trail fifth place Pennsylvania by only \$150. Oregon also has 50 Mooseheart Boosters so far. Isn't great to be an Oregon Moose!

Our newest capital project is another naming opportunity. This will put the proud Oregon name on a fourth classroom! It is a \$25,000 project for one of the two Health Occupation Classrooms. We look forward to our creative members coming up with new and fun projects to help us complete this project. As always we want to sincerely thank everyone, even the person that can only throw in a few coins in the Endowment Fund. There is strength in numbers and the members we have here in Oregon are outstanding and generous beyond belief.

Territorial Manager News



We have a great annual convention planned and I'm hoping lodge and chapter members are able to accompany their required delegates for what will be a very informative and enjoyable September weekend in Portland.

The following is the essence of an e-mail I sent to all lodge Board of Officers' members. I know many lodges posted the e-mail, but I am including it herein for those who may not have seen it. I cannot overemphasize the importance of each member's role in this initiative – we already are seeing very positive reactions at lodges embracing the changes; lodges that have returning members who had been "staying away", and local community service organization knocking at their doors for joint activities.

"Under guidance of the Supreme Council and our Director General, we are facing some monumental changes that are intended to rejuvenate our membership in embracing the foundation of our Order's Fraternal Purposes. Although each of us attested our commitment to these Purposes when we joined the Fraternity, many have not practiced it, and we - you and I, as well as Moose International - were remiss in the past by allowing that to happen. As we enter this "period of adjustment", we should anticipate push back to procedures that restrict or eliminate previously allowed activities, as well as disbelief in our resolve to the Back-to-Basics commitment. I am requesting each of you to be patient with those balking at the changes; I am advising you, as the lodge's management team, to be steadfast in observing the rules and processes that make this the great Fraternal Organization it is - in order for us to display that sign on our building, we must, and will, adhere to the image it represents.

"Additionally, we (you and I, the delegates of the recent Moose International Convention in Las Vegas) directed Moose International, among other General Laws amendments, to effect revolutionary changes in our membership processes that directly impacts access to our Social Quarters. This, too, can be expected to cause pause by some; but, our implementation must be applied uniformly across our Fraternal Units. We simply cannot enable dissenters to continue disallowed activities by moving to lodges that are not complying. This, absolutely, will not be tolerated.

"Back-to-Basics - the eventuality of achieving our "brand":

- being the heart of our local communities for the services we offer;
- maintaining a family-friendly social environment for our members to enjoy;
- operating an establishment that complies with government and organizational rules;
- providing the continual support, through membership and Fraternal Unit commitments, necessary to sustain our Fraternity's Institutions."

Have a great summer; see y'all in September.

Important Information for All Members as a result of the 2014 International Moose Convention

1. All recommended General Law revisions were approved by the membership during the votes taken Monday, June 23rd. Key changes that impact most Moose members include:
 - a. The option of reducing the number of Lodge Officers. Currently, the General Laws provide for three Trustees to be on the Board. The revision gives our lodges the choice between the current officer configuration and reducing the number of Trustees from three down to one. Dispensation from the General Governor's Office is required prior to reducing the number of Trustees.
 - b. Co-sponsorship between men and women. Members of the Loyal Order of Moose can now sponsor women into the Women of the Moose, and vice versa. Despite this change, the sponsorship rules still require an endorser from the lodge or chapter, as well as the review and approval of all candidates. Further, with the change in sponsorship policy, all individuals over the age of 21 are now considered candidates; therefore the guest policy of two visits before membership is required applies to all individuals, including lady friends of male members and gentlemen friends of female members. The only exceptions are spouses of current members, who still have no limits to the number of times they may visit. Both revisions go into effect Friday, August 1st, 2014
 - c. Expired Members can now re-enroll after six months. Expired members who do not wish to retain their prior years of service in the Fraternity may now re-enroll into a Lodge after six months. They must complete an application, mark it as a re-enrollment and submit it with all applicable fees. Only a Lodge vote is needed to re-enroll back into their previous Lodge; while an application review and Lodge vote is needed to re-enroll into a different Lodge.
This revision also will not go into effect until Friday, August 1st, 2014.
 - d. The Lodge hall or home may now be rented by members for business purposes. This provides another avenue for the Lodge to raise funds needed for operations. A dispensation by the General Governor is still required on these occasions.
 - e. New General Laws books are already in production. Updates are already being made to the hard copy version of the General Laws, but printing and distribution will take a minimum of several weeks to complete. Each Lodge will automatically receive 12 copies of the updated book. Online updates will be available in 7 – 10 days in the General Governor's section of the Moose website (www.mooseintl.org).
2. The Director General Announces a new Supreme Council Lodge Grant Program
 - a. The Supreme Council has designated up to \$1,000,000 per year for the next three years to fund a Lodge Grant Program designed to help Lodges repair, replace and upgrade equipment, facilities and systems at their Lodge homes. The Grants, which do not have to be repaid, will be distributed in amounts ranging from \$500 - \$25,000. This money cannot be utilized to pay taxes, past bills, loans or other commitments. The goal is to make our Lodges more attractive and functional for current and prospective members.
 - b. Information and access to an electronic application will automatically be distributed to all Lodges during the week of July 27th via an Official Communication, and materials will be posted online in the Members Only section of the Moose International website during that same week. Applications may be submitted starting August 1st with a cut-off date of October 31st. Funds will begin to be distributed as early as January 5th.

3. A New Member Orientation Program will be made available in August

- a. The program, complete with a new 15 minute video, was previewed during several breakout sessions during the International Convention. Also to be included are video presentations of the Lodge and Moose Legion Rituals.
- b. The entire package, including outline, scripts, videos (DVD format), etc. will automatically be sent to all Lodges in August. The video will also be posted to the Moose International YouTube video site by the end of July.

4. Convention Breakout Session Materials Available Online

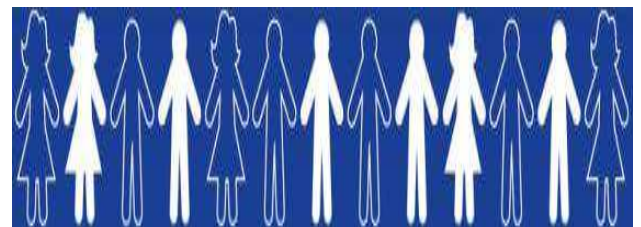
