

The Oregon Moose Annual Convention registration forms will be out shortly and will be available online. They will be sent digitally to all lodges, chapters, chairs, etc. Registration can also be performed, including payment through the OMA website. Please make note that the OMA Annual Convention dates have changed and will be held September 9, 10, and 11, 2022.

All lodges and chapters have received the Delegate Assignment forms for the 2022 OMA Annual Convention, <u>not to be confused with the International Convention</u>. Every lodge has two automatic delegates by virtue of their elected position which are the administrator and president. The balance of their delegates shall be quantified by lodge membership count and are elected by the members of the lodge with their name submitted via the aforementioned form. All members of The Moose in good standing in a Moose Lodge are invited and encouraged to register and attend. Properly registered delegates are entitled to conduct business, including make motions, seconds, and voting on matters before the body.

The revisions to the OMA Policy Manual were sent to all units on 5/16/2022 and again on 6/18/2022. Please make sure that your registered delegates are shown the proposed changes, as we will be seeking their approval. Also lodges will be receiving the OMA Association's Rules and Order Report, Minutes, and Financials later in August. These items also need to be shared with your delegates, as they require approval of the body.

OMA Memorial Chairman, Kathy Bendickson



From the Assn Membership Committee—Gail Steffens and Jacki Brinser, Chairmen

We're through the first quarter of our Moose year – wow that was fast! The winner of the Q3 2021-2022 OMA Membership Campaign, which was announced at Mid-year Conference, was Medford/Gold Hill

Lodge 178. Well, when the stats were tallied after Q4, Medford/Gold Hill maintained its lead in the state, winning both quarters. Huge congratulations to Medford/Gold Hill Lodge 178 for its successful production and retention numbers! Thank you for your diligence and commitment to membership. The award event, planned for the end of August, is sure to be a huge celebration!



One observation throughout last Moose year was that almost all lodges met or exceeded their production goals but fell short on retention goals. While it's fantastic we have been showing great growth numbers, it's clear we need to hone our focus on retaining members year over year and giving them reasons to keep renewing. Many of us just attended our district meetings, where we heard the reports of individual lodges attest to calling expired members. Has any correlation been made between the call efforts and subsequent renewals? Are callers taking notes or documenting any details from the calls? Sometimes expired members chose not to renew because they moved away, but sometimes they have become distant from their lodge because they felt excluded, bored, or simply disengaged. It is valuable to document the reasons given for letting membership expire because you can evaluate what's causing members to leave your lodge. Also, do you know what success rate your calls are producing? If you can look back at who was called and determine which and how many of them renewed after the conversation, that's a good measure of your call strategy effectiveness. If your calls are inspiring members to come back, that's great, keep it up and share your strategies with the committee and other lodges! If you have very few or no members returning after receiving calls, consider switching up your strategy. Hopefully we are demonstrating kindness, compassion, empathy, and interest in our approach toward expired members, and giving them a reason to reconsider letting their Moose membership lapse.

Lastly, my apologies for the delay in announcing a new annual OMA Membership Campaign. It's in the draft stages and will be approved in time to announce at the Annual Convention in September, but... we may have dropped a few hints in this article.


Youth Awareness—Terry Brier

The association is responsible for the two fun day outings—admission tickets for any place we take the students that requires a fee to get in and lunches. The association also provides food and drink for the student and adult hospitality rooms (no alcohol in the adult room) and any student gifts/remembrances (water bottles, back packs, blankets, etc.)

To ensure that the Oregon student congress will be memorable for the student participants, the OMA board has authorized the addition of a donation during the March of Checks beginning with this fall's convention. These donations will go towards meeting the association's financial goals to make the student congress a success. All lodges, districts, chapters, and Moose Legions are asked to give as they can in support of this great endeavor.




