

At Rally Day in Springfield, Betty May spoke about "who will fill our shoes" when we are gone. Her speech got me thinking about how to encourage our newer (and younger) members to get more involved in their Lodge and with The Moose.

So, how do we do that? As you sign up new members, invite them to an Orientation. If you are their sponsor, bring them in for a dinner or an activity. They joined for a

reason. Find out what attracted them to the Lodge and attend with them. Introduce new members to your friends. If you see someone that you don't know sitting alone, introduce yourself. You might make a new friend!

Selecting a mentor is very important. New members should select a mentor that is active in the Lodge and has similar interests. If the new member is interested in cooking meals at the Lodge, introduce them to those members in the kitchen. If they are interested in fundraising, ask the member having a fundraiser if they could use any help. You will be very surprised at how quickly they will say "yes!" You might make new friends!

How do you get more involved at the Lodge? Attend meetings and find out what is happening at the Lodge. Every Lodge has fundraisers where you can help. My first experience was doing dishes after a dinner, and I met a few people. Then I was asked to sell 50/50 tickets, and I met more people. 
